DO WE NEED PRAYERS?

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Prayer makes one complete

"Prayer does not necessarily change things for you, it changes you for things." - Swami Chinmayananda.

Last year, when my mother was on a deathbed, I prayed intensely for her life. A few days passed as if my prayers were not answered as her condition was deteriorating. Suddenly, one day, a realization dawned on me that she was suffering a lot and it was my love, which was holding her back. From that moment, I left everything to God's will, and when finally she passed away, I remained calm. This realization through prayers helped me to remain composed and experience my mother's presence beyond the physique.

Do we need Prayer?

When I first read about this topic, a counter question flashed in my mind as to whether we need food to live on?" What food is to body, prayer is to the mind. Prayer makes our mind healthy, positive, sensitive and humble. When we pray, we think positively and positive things are therefore attracted. Our attitude or reaction to the situation undergoes change, even as we derive strength from within.

How should we pray?

The way we pray is of utmost importance. Our prayer should be positive. To quote Rhonda Byrne from her book entitled 'The Secret', "When you focus your thoughts on something you want, and you hold that focus, you are in that moment summoning what you want from the mightiest power in the Universe. The law of attraction does not compute "don't" or "not" or "no", or any other words of negation." In other words, we get what we focus on the most. In the Universe two negatives do not make a positive. To illustrate, when you pray, "God please do not make me sick". The Universe will understand the same as "please make me sick". Eventually, we would fall sick as we attracted sickness by constantly focusing on it, we should rather pray that "God, please make me healthy" and the health would be attracted.

Prayer and Service

Service to mankind is prayer in action!

In May 2008, I visited a place called Nirmal Hriday (Tender-Hearts) a home for dying destitutes run by the Mother Teresa Foundation in Kolkata. I was touched to the core by the selfless services rendered by the volunteers to the terminally ill. I found that they pick people up dying on the roads in Kolkata and provide them not only refuge till their departure but also shower love, care and affection. One of the volunteers said, that "we are really doing no great thing but just are serving the suffering humanity – a prayer, indeed. I saw 'prayer in action' for the first time. Prayer until then to me was reciting a few hymns - the meaning of which I hardly ever knew. From childhood, I am a regular visitor to temples. I used to close my eyes, fold my hands, stand before the idol, in supplication and pray - seeking favors. I was begging rather than praying. During my spiritual retreat at Simultala I understood the true meaning of prayer. I learnt that prayer is not merely reciting hymns or visiting temples but it is a means of devoted communication with God. And one of the channels of communication could be service to the humanity - as it is said

"Manav Seva is Madhav Seva." To quote Mother Teresa "the fruit of silence is prayer, the fruit of prayer is faith, the fruit of faith is love, the fruit of love is service, the fruit of service is peace."

Prayer and Emotions

An emotion laden prayer is an invocation to His grace!

Questions often arise in our mind, as to how do we pray? And what will make God to answer our prayer? For prayer to be effective or responsive, it is not important how long we pray, but how intensely we pray. Intensity of prayer comes from the heart overwhelmed by emotions. Prayer without emotions is blabbery, whereas prayer packed with emotions does not need any verbalisation for, He is omnipotent and omniscient Who knows all your intend, spoken or otherwise.

A small boy in a Church was reciting alphabets – A,B,C,D. The presiding priest offered to teach him how to pray but was stunned by the answer given by the boy who said, "I know not complex hymns or words, though I know that they all are composed of alphabets, and

God being omnipotent, can understand my alphabets and He can compose a prayer for me of His choice. Needless to say that the prayer of that child was well received, rather than that of a priest who prayed more from his mind rather than from his heart; in other words, usage of intellect rather than emotion laden prayer. But then generating emotions in prayer is easier said than done. How does one go about it? Let me give you a simile. We human beings have launched many communication satellites whose signals are beamed across the globe. In order to receive these signals and strike a communication link, we need to adjust the frequency and/or wavelength of our handset (mobile). Some receive messages / images in colour, others in Black and White. The quality of communication depends upon the quality of the handset, that is, whether or not it is capable of receiving colour images, how it is programmed and so on. If we switch off the handset, we cannot receive any communication / message whatsoever, notwithstanding the fact that signals of the message are already in the atmosphere. But, remember, there is no flaw in His communication. We only need to fine-tune our receiving set to match His wavelength and frequency in order to strike a link for communication. This can be done through

love, faith and devotion, wherein faith and devotion make for proper programming and love acts as a battery to supply power, which will keep the receiving set turned on all the time. To understand this let us look closely at the structural components of prayer, namely, love, faith and devotion.

Prayer and Love

Prayer is the divine communion with God –the Supreme Being!

Love is the driving force behind the entire universe. It is supreme energy divine. See what happens when you fall in love. You praise that person; you like that person and love every action of him, isn't it? If this be your mental state in respect of love on the material plane, think how you would feel if you strike a loving relationship with the divine. When you do that, you do experience unity with the divine. Temptations to ask material benefits would cease altogether. The family of Narendra (Swami Vivekananda's name before he attained Sainthood) was in utter penury. Sri Ramkrishna Paramahansa asked him to ask something for his family when he went to the temple to pray before Goddess Kali. However, each time Narendra faced the

idol of Kali, he clean forgot to ask, as he surrendered to the Goddess in love and devotion. Once our heart is saturated with love, we develop unflinching devotion and faith in God.

Prayer and Faith

Faith moves mountains, prayer moves you!

Indeed, faith can move mountains, provided it is total and complete. Our faith cannot be so shaky that a small adversity could put us off from the chosen path of prayer and God. I remember during examination season I used to visit temple regularly and spend more time than in normal days for, I believed that it was necessary to secure His grace. If only my faith was total, I would not have behaved in this fashion, rather I would experience Him every moment of my life. We must not forget that God puts us on trials not to impair but to improve us. According to Gandhiji, "When all forsake you, God is always with you." Once we develop this unflinching faith and loyalty, we are ready to fight any battle of life as it comes, as someone has beautifully said, "Without Thee, I cannot succeed, And With Thee, I cannot fail."

Prayer and Devotion

Prayer is an expression of gratitude to the Almighty!

With love and faith in our heart, we surrender which leads to devotion. Devotion is prayer at the zenith. With devotion you are in constant communion- a state of bliss and your communication with God become complete. Sri Ramkrishna with his total devotion reached upto this level. He could go in trance at will and come back to the material world as easily.

At this stage, words / language have no significance. It is a communication from heart to heart.

My Prayer to God

If God does not answer your prayer, May be He has better plans for you!

Prayer to me is a source of strength and inspiration. Prayer changes our outlook towards life and makes us vibrant and positive. However, I am alive to the fact that I have miles to go and the journey has just begun as far as quality of my prayers is concerned. Earlier I used to trade off with God, i.e. to do Pooja or perform austerity with a view to seeking a favour in return. Realisation of my folly made me to change my prayer saying that, "I do not know what is good or bad for me, you are my Master and I am your slave; do bestow on me what I deserve and not what I desire." When a parent refuses to give chocolate the child feels bad but as he grows up he would thank his parent for saving his teeth from dental cavities. Likewise, when we become wiser, we would thank God for all that he deprived us in our best interests, as whatever He bestowed on us cannot but be good for us. In other words, if God answers our prayer, He is increasing our faith.

If He delays, He is increasing our patience. If He doesn't answer, He knows that we can handle the situation ourselves!

It reminds me of a wonderful prayer here.

Today, I thank God for everything that He has given me and I have no complaint about things I am deprived of. A sense of gratitude fills my heart, as a lamp of light engulfs a room when lit. The recess of our heart need to be lit, which is why, the common prayer line "oh, God, kindly lead me to light!"

However, let me confess that this realisation is still momentary and not lasting as the day wears off I am overwhelmed by desires and negative feelings, which I struggle to overcome with His aid, help, support and blessings, which will always be forthcoming. I am conscious about my shortcomings and would like to reach a plateau where prayer becomes a way of life and a refrain, not just one of the daily rituals as hitherto.

Prayer thus is a shield by which we can protect ourselves from the pervading negativity all around. Verily, we need prayers, for God is complete without our prayers, but as we are incomplete without His grace, we need to pray for our completeness. So be it!
